II. Program: **Constitutional Amendment for Quality Public Education – Former Minnesota Supreme Court Justice Alan Page and Minneapolis Federal Reserve Bank President Neel Kashkari**

Justice Alan Page and President Neel Kashkari are advocating for a proposed amendment to the Minnesota Constitution that establishes quality public education as a fundamental right for all students with the intent of eliminating Minnesota's achievement gap.

Kashkari has been president and chief executive officer of the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis since Jan. 1, 2016. He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in mechanical engineering from the University of Illinois. He became an aerospace engineer, developing technology for NASA missions. Eventually turning to finance and public policy, he earned his MBA from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School, joined Goldman Sachs, and served in several senior positions at the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Before joining the Minneapolis Fed, he ran for governor of California in 2014 on a platform focused on economic opportunity.

Page was an Associate Justice of the Minnesota State Supreme Court from January 1993 - August 2015. He is also known for his commitment to community, as is evidenced by his service on the board of directors of the Minneapolis Urban League from 1987 until 1990, as a member of the board of regents of the University of Minnesota from 1989 until 1993, and as the founder of the Page Education Foundation, which provides financial support to Minnesota's youth of color to pursue higher education. Page played college football and graduated with his bachelor of arts degree in 1967 from Notre Dame. He graduated from the University of Minnesota Law School in 1978, while playing for the Minnesota Vikings.
